Hello Folks,

Unless something very bad happens with coronavirus in our area, we as a Christian community will no longer have any mandatory COVID prevention practices as of Sunday, July 4th. Instead of writing that we “will no longer have any mandatory COVID prevention practices”, it would have been easier to say something like “reopening”. It would have been easier, but that would not be the truth. At least during my time as part of this community we have worshiped, baptized, communed, confirmed, educated (adults and youth), fed, housed, clothed, and pastorally cared for each other and the world around us.

I am reminded about the core of the argument between Pharaoh and God in Exodus. At first, all God asked for from Pharaoh was for God's people to take a break from doing Pharaoh's work so that they could God's work in the wilderness. In Hebrew, the words “worship” and “work” are closely related. God's people in our Bible worshiped/worked in building (tents, temples, and synagogues), but also at gates, at altars, by wells, near mountains, in deserts, and many other places. It is not the building that makes a place “God's house”, but rather the work/worship of the local assembly,

(It is also a bold claim to make that God has a house any longer, especially after the curtain was torn in the Temple at Christ's death.)

I have not been big on fantasizing about what I have missed about worship under COVID prevention practices. That just seemed to me like a practice in unnecessary suffering and frustration. But now that it is so close, I have broken my discipline and begun to imagine.

What do you miss the most? Singing? Hugging or handshakes during the greeting? The choir? Different ways of communing? Seeing each other faces? Things not being forced to change week-to-week because of the spread of a virus?

Here is what I have been missing – I have been missing prayers. In the congregations where I was trained, we had a sheet of paper folks could write their prayer requests on. Sometimes as a licensed pastor and intern those prayers gave me insight into what was going on with my community. It gave us a chance to take our petitions off of our prayer lists and onto the lips of our full community. I am most excited about us thanking God for our blessings, and asking God for our wants and needs, as a whole community.

I am not in the position to judge anyone's relationship with their God, but are there other benefits to attending regular worship? The big thing that jumps right out is receiving communion. Communion not only reminds us of the sacrifice Jesus made out of unconditional love for us, but acknowledges that we are sinners and need to be refreshed periodically. I always feel a big relief after communion, like taking a huge breath of fresh cool air. It gives me a renewed energy to take into the oncoming week and whatever that may involve. Another benefit to worship is praising God through song. Sharon Hatch said "praising God through worship is the best use of music and a person's musical talents". I couldn't agree more and guess what? As of July 4th Dekorra will resume singing during worship!! Attending worship creates fellowship with other Christians celebrating God's grace. There is something special about being a part of a group of people praying, singing and listening to Jesus teachings. I would call it "uplifting". So why am I rambling on about attending worship? Pretty simple. I want to see you at worship and share what I believe is an essential component of being a Christian. Please, come and worship regardless of how it moves you. Council has voted to remove all COVID-19 restrictions for worship beginning July 4th. It's been a long time coming! I encourage you to get the COVID-19 shot, but that is your personal choice. We will not be asking for proof of vaccination. The parking lot radio broadcast option for worship will continue to be available. 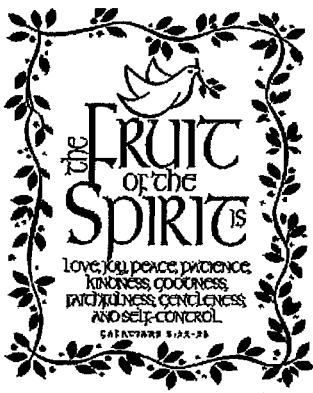

Current COVID Response

On June 17, 2021, the Council updated our indoor policy. 1) People who have been vaccinated do not need to wear masks during worship or other church gatherings. We ask that everyone else does wear a mask, unless they have a medical exception or they are young. 2) We will not be doing temperature checks or the other safety protocols. If you have a fever, please consider worshiping outdoors or from home. 3) Since June 6th we have been more flexible with indoor seating limits in the sanctuary. We will begin to formally do without those limits this Sunday, June 20th. For those who need more social distance, the Fellowship Hall, outdoor, and online options are still available. 4) Beginning July 4th, we folks can begin to sing again indoors and we will have no masking restrictions. This should complete the "reopening".

The Council will continue to monitor COVID activity and may make changes in the future. The Worship Team is considering alternative/additional worship times (i.e., a second Sunday service, a service on another day, etc.). Their next meeting is listed in these announcements. That team is working match up our worship services to the Sunday School and Confirmation education ministries starting this fall, and will also consider attendance.

Call to Order:

New Business:

Bill Schleichert explained the council proposal for calling a special congregational meeting which is to upgrade the church's audio/visual system, improve the worship experience at Dekorra, and bring our technology into the modern era.

Bill Schleichert made the motion on the behalf of the church council to approve the contract with Fearing's for the installation of an upgraded audio system and a new video system. The cost not to exceed \$40,000 and the amount financed with the Hometown Bank of Poynette will be \$30,000 for a period of 5 years. Sue Poznanski seconded. Discussion followed. Motion carried (43 yes/13 no) by a paper ballot vote.

John Weingandt made the motion to close the meeting at 11:35. Peggy Benson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor Lynk ended the meeting with a blessing.

Thursday, June 17, 2021

Call to Order: President Bill Buckley called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. in fellowship hall. Pastor Lynk opened the meeting with prayer.

Approve Agenda: Motion by Joen Bilsle to approve the agenda, seconded by Bill Schleichert. Motion carried.

Approve May 13, 2021 Council Minutes: Motion by Lyle Hendrickson to approve the minutes, seconded by Bill Schleichert. Motion carried.

Approve June 6, 2021 Special Congregation Meeting Minutes: Motion by Bill Schleichert to approve the minutes, seconded by Judy Brownrigg. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report: (Sterling Lynk)

1. The pastor performed one baptism for Sylvia Mae Olson.
2. The pastor performed eleven first communions on May 16 for: Austin Browne, Jaylee Busser, Charlotte Busser, Riley Birchler, Sawyer Koch, Kinzie Lintl, Parker Olson, Owen Olson, Jackson Holy, Elizabeth Carpenter, and Isla Glasser.
3. Pastor performed four confirmations on May 23 for: Grant Beyer, Lexie Birchler, Kristiana Hinzmann, and Summer Rake.
4. The pastor performed one funeral on May 20 for Greg Ayers.

President's Report:

1. Bill created a special congregational meeting mailing with the help of Oleg.
2. Bill is investigating more options to allow the church more bandwidth to allow for live streaming.
3. Bill sent a thank you letter to Peak whose audio/visual upgrade proposal we did not accept.

Treasurer's Report:

1. The checkbook balance on May 31, 2021, was \$29,011.99 a decrease of \$3,351.08 mainly due to an insurance payment. There was a total of \$15,372.31 in donations and expenses of \$18,723.39.
2. Lyle will transfer the money in the carpet fund to the screen fund.
3. Lyle Hendrickson made the motion to close the Jamie Benson Appeal Fund as of July 31, 2021, and the contributions to this fund are presented to Jamie in a check to start her career as a pastor. Judy Brownrigg seconded. Motion carried. Moving forward the account will be named the Seminary Appeal Fund to be used for future seminarians from our church or synod.
4. Motion by Bill Schleichert to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Jane Manke. Motion carried.

All Committee Reports:

Christian Education

1. Jean continues to add newsletter items.

2. The church website now contains the calendar and newsletter.
3. Lynn Lund has agreed to help Pastor with next year's confirmation class.
4. Planning is underway to start in person Sunday School with Rally Day on September 12. We will offer 4K through 6th grade. Mary is working on staffing, curriculum, and schedule.
5. We are researching for a separate pre-confirmation curriculum for the 6th grade.
6. Acolyte training is scheduled for early fall.
7. DLC book club will resume in September.

Worship

1. Preparations are being made for Sunday School Rally Day on September 12. We are still looking to staff Sunday School.
2. The Worship Committee recommends that as of July 4 church be opened up with no restrictions including music. This includes getting the hymnals back in church, starting up the choir, and allowing singing in the church.
3. When to offer church services is being addressed including a possible Wednesday evening service.
4. The worship Committee will meet with Hospitality to discuss the church picnic set for August 22nd.

Property

1. A new light pole will soon be installed in the parking lot. They are waiting on the electrician.

Mutual Ministry

1. Bill Schleichert shared that this committee is an ongoing process.

Hospitality

1. Hospitality will meet with the Worship Committee to discuss the church picnic.

Youth and Family

1. Meeting to see if there is interest and workers to plan to attend the national youth gathering in Minneapolis in July of 2022.

Old Business:

1. Re-open Update: Ann Carncross stated that she was ready to reopen the church with music and meet with the choir to further discuss church music. Motion by Judy Brownrigg to open up the church on July 4th with no restrictions including congregational singing. Seconded by Bill Schleichert. Motion carried.
2. The Fearing audio/visual proposal was passed out. Retail screen prices will be compared with Fearing's screens to see if they can meet retail prices. If they do, we have their screen guarantees and commercial screens. Bill Schleichert moved that we pay Fearing 50% of the project as agreed upon by July 5th and that the money is taken from the screen fund and general fund if the loan is not yet in place. Joen Bilse seconded. Motion carried.
3. The Constitution Committee has met several times. The committee has completed the reading of all mandatory chapters. Next, they will work on chapters where there are options.

New Business:

1. All Committee night will resume on September 14 at 6:30 in the fellowship hall. The second Tuesday of each month was suggested.
2. The next council meeting will be held July 8, 2021, at 6:30 p.m. in the fellowship hall.

Bill Schleichert moved to adjourn, seconded by Joen Bilse. Motion carried.

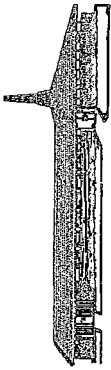
