Hello You,

Now back to the conversation about the traits of vital congregations.

As a reminder, during All Committee Nights, we engage in a little devotion, bible study, and discussion about how the Holy Spirit is changing the church-universal. By "church-universal", I am referring to that thing in our creeds we call "the holy catholic and apostolic church". Folks study congregations and Jesus communities and have discovered different ways to describe the healthiest, most resilient, and strongest of us. Those communities have shifted their expectations and assumptions about church, the world, and God to follow where the Spirit leads. The folks that regularly attend All Committee Nights have explored and reviewed all thirteen shifts.

In this column we have looked at six of those shifts: 1) Shifting from Seeing God Mainly Working Inside the Church to God Mainly Working Outside the Church; 2) Shifting from us Using Language About the Action of the Church (and Ourselves) to Language About the Action of God; 3) Shifting from Performance to Participation; 4) Shifting from Using Language about Development to Language about Journey; 5) Shifting from Church Membership to Discipleship; and, 6) From Speaking to Listening.

This month let's look at another shift – 7) From Working for Others to Being with Others.

I have a close friend who gets really annoyed with me, and often angry with me. Why? Because I often show up with things and help for her that she didn't ask for. I am sometimes confused or hurt by her feelings. I am pretty sure she needs the things I show up with. And, I am a Jesus person and Jesus asked me to show up for people. In addition, often the Holy Spirit shows up for me with a realization that sounds something like "Oh! They need a thing and I can do that." So, whenever that voice rings out in my head I tend to listen. But, most of all, I am just trying to help so should she just be grateful?

The truth is that the voice in my head is rarely the Holy Spirit, even the one that says I can do something.

The reality is that my friend does need a lot. This isn't a judgment. I need a lot. I bet a lot of you do too. The thing is that my friend hates me when I assume what she needs or wants. Anticipation is a killer in this friendship. I need to confess the sin of over-anticipation. Instead, Jesus-people are called

to abide with the people around them as much as work for them. By "to abide" I mean to live with, show up for, be present with, be an accomplice with, to remain with, etc. For example, it is very different to give a person without housing food as you walk by than to sit with that person or even live life with them. Like practice #5 (moving from speaking to listening), I need to just show up better than just speaking with what I believe would be helpful. And, I need to remember how I feel is not the ultimate arbiter of what is good.

The Rev. Matthew Short of the Greater Milwaukee Synod is my source for these shifts. He notes, "We have all too often assumed we know what others need, and that our job as Christians is to work hard to provide those things. While this is a loving impulse, it does have two negative effects. First, it continues to play into the narrative that our job as Christians is to do more and work harder. Many people in our congregations are tired! They need a sabbatical from doing so to be allowed to simply be together. The second negative effect is that our work 'for' others often sets up a power differential in which the church sees itself as having the answers or the resources needed by others. In this script, the 'neighbor' is seen as having a deficit we can address. However, if we assume God is the active agent in our shared life, and God is active outside our congregation as much (or more) than inside, then we can assume we will meet God in each other and in the neighbor. We can assume God is already creating community both inside and outside the church. We can assume that 'the gifts of God come wrapped in people' and that a key way to experience God's presence is to dive into a relationship with each other."

Does this seem hard? Is abiding with each other difficult? It is so hard! It is so hard that Jesus showed up to show us how to do it, to ask us to do it, to breathe into us and feed himself into us so we can do that. And, there is the good news. There is the promise.
