#### **ANNUAL MEETING JANUARY 28, 2024**



#### **January 2024 Newsletter**

While [Joseph and Mary] were [in Bethlehem], the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger because there was no place in the guest room.

[Jesus] entered Jericho and was passing through it. A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd, he could not, because he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him because he was going to pass that way. When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him. All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor, and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."

Hello You,

Since Advent started earlier this month, one question has taken up all of the space in my brain. That question is, "How has God made room for me?"

I cannot take credit for the question eating my brain. It shows up often in the preparation materials for the **How Does a Weary World Rejoice?** worship theme. It even shows up during worship itself in the invitation to communion. In the last few weeks, we have gotten invited to the meal with words like these:

"Jesus was born into a world that told him right away, "There's no room for you here." Mary and Joseph were turned away from every door, so Jesus was born in a stable instead of a house. He was laid in a manger instead of a crib. Friends, today you will not be turned

away, because Jesus spent the rest of his life making room. He made room for tax collectors and children. He made room for five thousand people to sit down and eat together. He made room for Samaritan women, Jews, and Gentiles. He made room for the sick, for the outcast, for the unclean. Jesus was always pulling up a seat, saving space, making room for people, and he has made room for you."

I experience this bit of liturgy with the wonder of "He has made room for me? Is that a promise? If it is, then that is definitely good news! Whoohooo!" And, it makes me think about the different ways my God and my Savior have done just that.

One of the things I like to do during our annual middle school lock-ins is to ask the young adults a God-question. The lock-in on December 15<sup>th</sup> was no different. I bet you can guess the question I asked them.

Of course, I asked them "How has God made room for you?"

They shared with me so many ways God has made a place for them, and I will share with you what they said this year at 4:00 pm on Christmas Eve.

So, it is now time for me to ask you a God question. Our God has made room for you. That is a promise. But, can you think of ways our God has done that for you?

I do know one thing. Our God has made a lot of room for the Jesus-people here at Dekorra Lutheran Church. 155 years' worth of room, that is how much room!

And, that is a lot of room. That is a lot of people fed and housed and clothed. That is a lot of people who have had Jesus shared with them. That is a lot of fellowship and friendship. That is a lot of worship music and stewardship. That is just a lot.

I pray there is more coming. I hope there is more coming. I believe there is more coming. So, let's celebrate the room made for us as individuals and as a community. Our first part is right away on January 7<sup>th</sup>, with our first monthly birthday celebrations both during worship and after.

DLC Book Club - Wednesday, January 17th at 1:00pm

The DLC Book Club is excited to begin its eighth year of discussion and fellowship! Please join us to discuss our first selection of the year, *Abide With Me*, by Elizabeth Strout. In prose incandescent and artful, Elizabeth Strout draws readers into the details of ordinary life in a way that makes it extraordinary. All is considered life, love, God, and community within these pages, and all is made new by this writer's boundless compassion and graceful prose.

In the small town of West Annett, Maine, a minister struggles to regain his calling, his family, and his happiness in the wake of profound loss. At the same time, the community he has served so charismatically must come to terms with its own strengths and failings, faith and hypocrisy, loyalty and abandonment when a dark secret is revealed. Tyler Caskey has come to love West Annett, "just up the road" from where he was born. The short, brilliant summers and the sharp, piercing winters fill him with awe as does his congregation, full of good people who seek his guidance and listen earnestly as he preaches. But after suffering a terrible loss, Tyler finds it hard to return to himself as he once was. He hasn't had The Feeling that God is all around him, in the beauty of the world for quite some time. He struggles to find the right words in his sermons and in his conversations with those facing crises of their own and to bring his five-year-old daughter, Katherine, out of the silence she has observed in the wake of the family's tragedy. A congregation that had once been patient and kind during Tyler's grief now questions his leadership and propriety. In the kitchens, classrooms, offices, and stores of the village, anger, and gossip have started to swirl. And in Tyler's darkest hour, a startling discovery will test his congregation's humanity and his own will to endure the kinds of trials that sooner or later test us all.

December 2023 Meeting Minutes Met on November 24, 2023

Absent: Kathy Statz, Kathy Burhop, Marj Weingandt

Diane reported on the last All Committee meeting. Their main concerns were ideas for the celebration of our church's 155th Anniversary. They also discussed the church's budget - the money we have and the best usage of that money. It was also suggested that we have a coffee hour each month to celebrate parishioners whose birthdays are that month.

Sharon will speak with Mary Thompson and Ellen Keller to determine which date would best be used to honor Lorraine's years of service to the Altar Guild. The two dates under discussion are January 7 and January 21. We will finalize plans for her retirement at our next meeting. We discussed the possibility of honoring Margo Holzman's 55 years of quilting here at Dekorra.

Pastor Sterling would like the youth to be more involved in Wednesday's Lenten services. Our recommendation is that the confirmands, their coordinators, and their mentors take charge of the planning and implementation of those Wednesday night services. Judy will take this recommendation to the next Council meeting. In addition to the work Merry Seng does with the children on Sunday mornings, she will also be playing for Wednesday evening services.

Since Christmas Eve falls on the 4th Sunday in Advent this year, the focus of the service will be on Advent in the morning service and the celebration of Christmas in the evening. Pastor Sterling will pick the songs for the morning service and the choir will sing for the evening service.

Sharon is still looking for a few volunteers for Blue Christmas and Christmas Day services. Christmas Day service will be a hymn singing of Christmas songs. We believe Pastor Sterling is going to select the songs to be sung. Ann will check with him to be sure

Sharon spoke with Lyle about music licensing and he said that the money for that comes out of another place in the church budget, not Worship. Sharon did have our budget increased to \$300 since everything has gone up in price. We have begun using battery-operated candles with each service and the cost of batteries has also impacted the budget. There is a choir fund for replacement December 2023

of the choir robes but since we no longer use choir robes, we decided to keep the money set aside for future purposes.

Dee will be gone from the end of December until March or April to help her son and his family. She has taken notes on everything that she has been taught by Lorraine and intends to write it all down, step by step. That record will be kept in the sacristy for future use.

The altar legs are looking a little shabby. This should be looked at and attended to by the Property Committee.

At our next meeting, we will review the All Saints and Thankoffering services. We will also discuss the yearly calendar. We would like to have a blessing of the bikes. We might want to consider having a bicycle ride and motorcycle ride as part of the event. We would also like to consider having a special day for the blessing of the pets. We need to determine if these blessings should be incorporated into existing services or if they should be held as separate events. We hope to hold 2 hymn songs next year - one in spring and one in fall. We will discuss this more next month.

Our next meeting will be held on Friday, December 29th at 9:00 AM.
